This is a summary of how our school delivers music education to all our pupils across three areas – curriculum music, co-curricular provision and musical experiences – and what changes we are planning in future years. This information is to help pupils and parents or carers understand what our school offers and who we work with to support our pupils' music education.

Part A: Curriculum music

This is about what we teach in lesson time, how much time is spent teaching music and any music qualifications or awards that pupils can achieve.

Our school follows the national curriculum and uses the Sing Up scheme. Our music curriculum is published on our website. All pupils have weekly music lessons.

Part B: Co-curricular music

All pupils have access to music teaching and learning. Key Stage Two pupils receive specialist instrumental teaching in small groups in addition to the Sing Up music curriculum. Currently guitar teaching is offered. This is not a charged music service.

Instruments are also offered by our school. Singing is incorporated in to our daily school life. We use Sing Up to enthuse our pupils with meaning and relevant song materials.

C: Musical experiences

This is about all the other musical events and opportunities that we organise, such as singing in assembly, concerts and shows, and trips to professional concerts.

The children will have the opportunity to watch a professional performance during their time at our school. These include visits to orchestras and theatre shows.

Singing is regularly included in assemblies. Sing Up materials are used to support the singing teaching and learning.

Our children take part in regular performances to an audience, including harvest, Christmas and class assemblies.

Musical instruments are available in our playground to support creativity during free time. These were purchased by our 3LX Friends group.

In the future

This is about what the school is planning for subsequent years.

Our pupils are currently accessing at least one hour of music per week. We plan to continue music tuition for all Key Stage Two pupils. We will evaluate the musical instruments and resources.

We will work with the other schools in our Trust to ensure we offer further performance opportunities.
